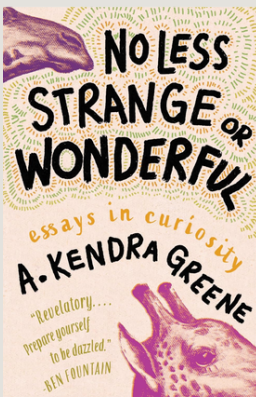
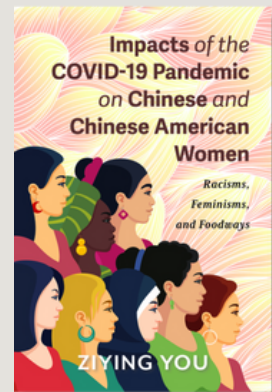
A FULL DAY OF LITERARY FUN

A tale of male friendship and loneliness, the novel *Great Disasters* by Grady Chambers follows six young men from their early 2000s Chicago high school, through the war, love, and heartbreak. Slipping between memories and adulthood, it explores humor, hope, addiction, loss and more in this portrait of friends moving forward together and apart.

During the pandemic, Chinese and Chinese American women faced a double threat of illness and vitriolic racism. In its aftermath, folklorist Ziyang You addresses this experience by examining gender, religion, community building, and more, alongside connections with historical and enduring racism.
